

## Who runs NOhep?

NOhep is an independent initiative which originated as a response to a strong call from the hepatitis community for a global movement and a campaign which increases recognition of viral hepatitis similar to the red ribbon and HIV/AIDS.

The World Hepatitis Alliance (WHA) currently acts as the secretariat for NOhep, receiving input from a taskforce comprised of WHA members, an external international campaign agency and civil society organisations.
